Since 1975, this nonprofit has been the leader in the dog assistance industry, serving people with a wide variety of disabilities. Canine Companions has developed a successful formula for breeding, raising, and training service dogs and operates training centers across the country. Our November speaker, **CEO Paige Mazzoni**, oversees their 37 million dollar annual budget. We hope to have her bring along one of their four legged friends.

Paige has been the chief marketing officer at VIP Petcare and she has held management roles at Oracle and Sybase as well as serving on the executive committee of several nonprofit fundraising boards, including the Buck Cardinal Board at Stanford University, her alma mater.

- Take Time to Read—special project spreading the joy of reading in our community through monthly family get-togethers with story times, reading, book giveaways, and sharing a meal together.




- Book Buddies—companion project pairing up teen volunteers with young elementary-age children at Healdsburg Elementary School for afterschool reading time together.

### 2024 SRJC Scholarships for Re-entry Women

"Our efforts are making a difference"

As a part of our mission to encourage and support higher education for women, the Healdsburg AAUW awarded \$20,000 in scholarships in 2024 to five highly deserving, re-entry women who graduated from Santa Rosa Junior College and are now pursuing their degrees at a four-year college/university. These awards bring the total amount in scholarship awards to SRJC students to \$375,000 since 1995. This year's applicants were carefully screened via AwardSpring, an online scholarship and donor management platform that was introduced to the SRJC in 2019. Each finalist was then interviewed by our committee via Zoom. This year's scholarship committee included **Maureen Keefe**, **Phil Wright**, and myself.

Each year, our committee is so inspired by the motivation and drive of our scholarship recipients. Their determination to return to school after years of overcoming a variety of obstacles is impressive. Each of our recipients worked through and overcame the challenges that confronted them, returned to school, graduated from Santa Rosa Junior College, and are now pursuing their baccalaureate degree at a four-year college/university. Here is a brief look into the goals and aspirations of our 2024 recipients:

- McKenna wants to become an attorney to help marginalized communities and women who have experienced domestic violence.
- Chelsea will get her Bachelor degree in Environmental Studies and plans to fight climate change.
- Jamie will pursue a BA in Human Development as well as attend a school for canine studies to ultimately train service/therapy dogs
- Noemi aspires to attend law school and become an attorney to contribute to her community and help her family access the support they need.
- Jessica, who has worked as a medical assistant for 9 years, has been inspired to get a degree in nursing!

Our deserving recipients have not only worked hard to better their own lives, but they are focused on making a difference in the lives of others and in their communities. Our 2024 recipients volunteer in many organizations in their communities in addition to working, caring for their families, and keeping up with their studies.

#### **BETSY HAFNER**

Betsy is not a new comer to Healdsburg! She started coming to Healdsburg shortly after her parents (Dick and Mary Hafner) bought a prune farm in Alexander Valley (soon to become a vineyard) in 1967. In the years since, she has learned to appreciate the powerful connection to agricultural land and to the Healdsburg community developed by her parents. It is no small wonder she was drawn back to Healdsburg.

Her college years included Smith College, UC Berkeley, and the University of Kent in Canterbury, England,. She then graduated from UC Berkeley with a major in English history. A law degree was completed from Boston University as well as a Masters from The Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy. Upon graduation, Betsy moved

to Washington, DC working for the U.S. International Trade Commission. Later, she joined the law firm of Powell, Goldstein, Frazer & Murphy, practicing international trade law. Her final chapter in DC was marked by joining the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, ending her career as the Deputy Assistant U.S. Trade Representative for Russia and Eurasia. Betsy retired from government service in April, 2023.

Returning to Healdsburg in December that same year, Betsy was introduced to AAUW through Sue Campbell and the Friday hiking group. It took her no time to decide to join the group based on the interesting, diverse, educated women she met on the hikes.

What would you like to say to young women: I want to encourage young women to go into public service where they can pursue fascinating and rewarding careers.
